Sweeney's book stories center mostly around religion—including Catholicism, neo-Hasidism, and a detour with Ramakrishna monks—but not exclusively. Tolstoy's folktales, M.R. James' ghost stories, a history of Hitler, and Jean Craighead George's novel about a boy making his way alone in the woods outside New York City, are also here. "Sweeney makes a charming companion, telling stories in joyful reflection," writes Jeff Deutsch, director of Seminary Co-op Bookstores, and author of *In Praise of Good Bookstores*.

My Life in Seventeen Books: A Literary Memoir (Hardback; ISBN 978-1958972311; US \$23.) publishes on May 7, 2024. The author will have an event that night at Boswell Book Company in Milwaukee. On May 8 he'll be at Chicago's Seminary Co-op, and on May 9, at Literati in Ann Arbor.

Jon M. Sweeney is an award-winning author who has been interviewed in print by a range of publications from the *Dallas Morning News* to *The Irish Catholic*, and on television for CBS Saturday Morning and many other programs. His book, *The Pope Who Quit*, (Image) was optioned by HBO. He is also the author of forty other books on spirituality, mysticism, and religion, including the best-seller, *Meister Eckhart's Book of the Heart*, coauthored with Mark S.
